Dutch professionals and experts working on heritage projects in or with Ghana will gather in order to exchange experience and knowledge on projects and activities in the field of Ghanaian-Dutch Mutual Cultural Heritage.








Route Description

The Ghana Heritage Day will be held at the **Atelier Gebouw Rijksmuseum**, located at **Hobbemastraat 22**, 1071 ZC Amsterdam









Public transport

- From Central Station: tram 2 and 5 (stop Hobbemastraat)
- From station Amsterdam Zuid/WTC: tram 5 (stop Hobbemastraat)
- From station Amsterdam Sloterdijk: tram 12 (stop Concertgebouw)
- From station Amsterdam Amstel: metro to Weesperplein, from there tram 7 or 10 (stop Spiegelgracht)
- From busstation Marnixstraat: bus 26, 65, 66, 170 (or walk 10 minutes)

By car

To the Jan Luijkenstraat

- Drive Eastward on the A10
- Take exit s109 in the direction of s110/RAI/Rivierenbuurt
- Continue on the Europaboulevard/s109
- After 550m, turn lift to Scheldeplein/ s109
- Keep left on the junction, continue on the **s109**
- After 850m, turn right to the Stadionweg/s108
- After 500m, turn right to the **Hobbemakade/s108**
- After 1,2km, turn left to the **Stadhouderskande/s100**
- After 150m, turn left to the Jan Luijkenstraat

To Q-Park Van Baerlestraat

From Ringweg-Zuid

- Drive Eastward on the **A10**
- Take exit s109 in the direction of s110/RAI/Rivierenbuurt
- After 450 m, turn right towards **De Boelelaan**
- After 89m, take a slight leftward bend to the **De Boelelaan**
- After 750m, turn right to the **Beethovenstraat**
- After 1,8km, follow the road to **Johan M. Coenenstraat**
- After 350m, turn left to **Roelof Hartplein**
- After 57m, follow the road to the **Van Baerlestraat**

From there it is only a short walk towards the Rijksmuseum.
